# THE BIG YEAR

*Did you learn anything new from God's Word this week in your readings,  
or through Sunday's message?*

1. Have you had a 'wilderness experience' where God allowed you to suffer the consequences of a poor decision?

## **READ DEUTERONOMY 6:1-5**

2. The book of Deuteronomy is Moses' last official word to the nation of Israel (shortly before his death) after leading them for over forty years. What do you think would have been the most difficult part of leading these people in the desert?
3. What do you think the 'vibe' might have been like in Israel as they approached the Promised Land?

## **READ DEUTERONOMY 6:6-12**

4. Whose job was it to teach spiritual truth to the next generation? How can we apply this to our context today?
5. Is there a real danger that the people may forget the Lord when they settle in the Promised Land (vs 10-12)? What is it about the conditions in the Promised Land that threaten their 'remembrance' of God?

## **READ DEUTERONOMY 6:13-25**

6. Why is God a jealous God? Isn't jealousy a sin?
7. According to vs 23, why did God bring the Israelites out of Egypt?
8. What does obedience to the laws do for the Israelites according to vs 24-25?

## **READ DEUTERONOMY 29:1-6**

9. Do you sense God's (and Moses') frustration at the lack of understanding among the people? What is it that they 'just don't get'? Are we the same way?
10. What do vs 4-5 tell us about the way God deals with His disobedient people?

## **READ DEUTERONOMY 34:1-8.**

11. What was God's final gift to Moses before he died? Was it more than he deserved, or less?

*By faith Moses... considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward. (Hebrews 11:25-26)*
